A Synod of Travelers

God told Abram: "Leave your country, your family, and your father's home for a land that I will show you." Genesis 12:1



Dear Friends in Christ,

Having just returned from a sabbatical journey, I found myself thinking about all the important stories in Scripture where people are on a journey. During these journeys, there are always surprises and unexpected encounters along the way. Sometimes the surprises are joyful; sometimes the surprises are difficult and even painful. Yet, it becomes clear that God is with the travelers on their journey and is at work through the surprises in ways that are life-changing.

For example, in Acts 8, the disciple Phillip is instructed by the Spirit to walk the road from Jerusalem to Gaza. Along the way, he meets an Ethiopian court official, who was himself on a journey. The Ethiopian official was on his way back to Ethiopia, but he was also on a spiritual journey. He asks Phillip to help him understand a reading from the prophet Isaiah. Phillip uses the opportunity to tell him about God's embracing love for all people revealed in Jesus. Coming upon a spring of water, the court official surprises Phillip with the question, "Is there anything that should prevent me from being baptized?" Up to this point, no Gentile (non-Jewish) people had been baptized. The Spirit immediately moves Phillip to baptize the Ethiopian and then the Spirit transports Phillip away to a different region.

In Genesis 32, Jacob is on a journey to meet his brother, Esau, from whom he had stolen the family inheritance and blessing many years before. The night before he meets Esau, Jacob is surprised to find himself wrestling with God. By the time the wrestling match is done, both Jacob's name and life-purpose are changed.

In Luke 7, Jesus is walking with his disciples on the road near the village of Nain and unexpectedly encounters a funeral procession for a young man who was his mother's only son. She herself was a widow. Seeing the mother's pain and loss, Jesus is stirred with compassion. He steps forward and raises the young man back to life, which shocks and amazes everyone present.

Then, there is Saul/Paul on the road to Damascus, suddenly encountering the risen Christ (Acts 9). In Luke 24, two disciples on their way home to Emmaus when they meet Jesus, who they were certain was dead.

The list goes on. Story after story in Scripture of people on a journey who encounter something unexpected. The surprise they experience may be joyful or painful or simply confusing. Yet, the travelers come to discover that God is present in the encounter and filling them yet again with blessing and life.

These sacred stories pose a question to us: What journey are you on right now? What journey is your family and your congregation on? What are the surprises that you are experiencing? How might God and Jesus be filling and stretching you with new life in these unexpected encounters? I invite you to take some sabbath moments to think about these questions.

It helps me to know that we never need to make these journeys on our own. The Spirit of Christ is, of course, always surrounding and filling us. Plus, we have each other. I always delight in remembering that the word "synod" means "on the road together". We are a synod of travelers united by God's love and then sent out to travel the roads of our neighborhoods, seeking God's shalom. Thank you for traveling this road with me!

2024 ELCA Youth Gathering and Young Adult Gathering Updates

The ELCA Youth Gathering and Young Adult Gathering will be held in New Orleans July 16-20, 2024. Prior to the Gatherings, there are 2 other options: MYLE (Multicultural Youth Leadership Event) and the tAble (open to youth who are ages 14-18 or are engaged in a high school youth group or are enrolled in high school or the vocational education equivalent). Priority registration for these events begins Sept. 15. The ELCA Youth Gathering has three different brackets for registration:



Priority Registration (Sept. 15-Nov. 1, 2023): \$375

Regular Registration (Nov. 2, 2023-Feb. 14, 2024): \$425

Late Registration (Feb. 15-April 15, 2024): \$475

MYLE and the tAble have a registration fee of \$190; however, thanks to a generous donor, that fee will be waived for the first 1,000 people to register for MYLE and the first 200 people to register for the tAble.

A \$150 nonrefundable, per-person deposit is due at time of registration for the Gathering and Young Adult Gathering and must be paid within the registration rate you expect to pay.

Please note that hotel, meals and travel costs are not included in this registration fee. For more information please visit the <u>Congregational Registration</u> page.

Participants register as congregational groups, with one adult serving as the primary adult leader. The primary adult leader is the organizer for the group, receiving communications from the Gathering about housing, payments and any other relevant information. Once your congregation has registered, please contact Pastor Brenda at bfrelsi@montanasynod.org She will be working to organize transportation for all congregations that wish to travel together (this is not required, but adds to the community building of the experience).

Rulemaking Hearing

From Washington Paid Family & Medical Leave

On September 19, 2023, Employment Security Department filed a CR-102 for Paid Family and Medical Leave rulemaking. The CR-102 was filed to amend existing rules to implement legislation that passed during the 2023 legislative session. Substitute Senate Bill (SSB) 5286 made changes to RCW 50A.10.030 regarding how the annual premium rate is calculated for employers and employees. SSB 5586 made changes to RCW 50A.25.040 that will allow employers to access information about their current employees who are taking paid family or medical leave. In addition, the proposed changes align public records rules with agency rules that are already in place. View the text of the proposed rules and supporting documents on our website in the "Current Rulemaking" section.

A rulemaking hearing will be held via TEAMs and we encourage anyone interested in the proposed rules to provide testimony.

Please note that this hearing is not related to any application or claim you may have filed with the department. This is an opportunity for you to voluntarily provide testimony on proposed Paid Leave regulations at a public hearing that is required by law. Attendance is optional.
