- Ecumenical cohort relationships that amplify what is possible
- Connections to regional partners who are subject matter experts in financing, housing development and church building stewardship

COHORT APPROACH



The core of this work is **community discernment**, which is possible when we accept our identity as stewards, use the practices of sacred organizing, and pursue a vision of shared liberation.

In our cohort, we explore:

- Practices for listening deeply
- How we can practice stewardship
- Wrestling with racism and other structural obstacles to shalom
- How to build a critical mass of support for new directions
